NUTRIEN PRESIDENT + CEO

Nutrien Ltd. has named Ken Seitz their new president + CEO after a months-long global talent search. Seitz, who grew up on a dairy farm in Saskatchewan, said he's "honoured and humbled" to work alongside growers during challenging times.

Seitz had been serving in an interim position since January and previously headed up Nutrien's potash operation. Russ Girling, chairman of Nutrien's board of directors, says the company's record performance during some of the most turbulent times in the sector underscores the strength of Seitz's leadership.

DRINKLE ART WALL

In 2020, Drinkle building owner Dave Denny created what is now known as the Drinkle Art Wall. Originally embracing the untapped creativity that was within our city, the Drinkle Art Wall has grown not only beyond its walls but also beyond our borders.

This month nearly 30 new pieces are being added to the wall, including works from Sherbrook Creative Arts, Future Artistic Minds, and a Ukrainian war victim. Ksenia Igolkina created her artwork under the sound of air raid sirens while living in Kyiv. She has since seen her artwork displayed in areas all around the world including Saskatoon. ADVOCACY CONTINUES FOR SHELTERS + NEIGHBOURS

Together with the Saskatoon Chamber of Commerce, Downtown Saskatoon wrote a letter to the City on July 26 discussing the importance of ensuring shelter facilities are in the right locations. We have many years of observing the implications when shelters are inserted into buildings ill-suited to support their activities, and the implications for all stakeholders, including those who rely on the services provided is significant. We believe that future shelter applications should involve dedicated public hearings with final approval resting with Saskatoon City Council. It is our understanding that the current approval process rests at the administrative level where applications for shelter facilities are reviewed against the requirements of zoning and other bylaws. We have also asked the city to consider zoning changes that would provide on-site outdoor spaces for shelters too, in proportion to the number of people they shelter. This would

provide residents with a safe and welcoming location to gather while safeguarding their dignity and well-being.

The following construction updates border or extend from the north edge of the Downtown district. Roadways in and out of the district will be affected.

1st Avenue North from Princess Street to Duke Street & Duke Street from 1st Avenue North to 2nd Avenue North

- Anticipated to begin August 15th

1st Avenue North from Queen Street to Princess Street & King Street from City Yards to 2nd Avenue North

- Anticipated to begin August 15th

1st Avenue North from 24th Street East to Queen Street

- Anticipated to begin August 15th

King Street from 2nd Avenue North to 5th Avenue North

- Anticipated to begin in early September

King Street from 5th Avenue North to 7th Avenue North

- Anticipated to begin in mid-September
