### CITY GRANT PROGRAMS

The Former Third Avenue United Church (304 Third Ave N), now St. Vincent of Lerins Orthodox has been approved by city council for funding, to a maximum of \$23,500 for exterior building rehabilitation including painting, staining and window sealing.

Designed by Architect John N. Semmons in the English Gothic architectural style it was designated a municipal heritage property in 2017.


### SHEEPDOGS

## CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

The water main maintenance work on 2nd Avenue South from 20th Street East to 21st Street East is now complete, and the remaining work on 21st Street East continues to progress on schedule. Below are the anticipated timelines for construction scheduled in the 2022 construction season:

- **20th Street East from 2nd Avenue South to 4th Avenue South**
  - o Sidewalk and curb rehabilitation work – **Complete**
  - o Road rehabilitation work – **Complete**
- **2nd Avenue South from 19th Street East to 20th Street East**
  - o Sidewalk and curb rehabilitation work – **Complete**
  - o Road rehabilitation work – **Complete**
- **2nd Avenue South from 20th Street East to 21st Street East**
  - o Sidewalk and curb rehabilitation work – **Complete**
  - o Water main maintenance work – **Complete**
- **2nd Avenue South from 21st Street East to 22nd Street East**
  - o Sidewalk and curb rehabilitation work – **Complete**
  - o Road rehabilitation work – **Rescheduled to spring 2023**
- **21st Street East from 1st Avenue South to 2nd Avenue South**



- o Sidewalk and curb rehabilitation work – **Complete**
- o Water main maintenance work – **Underway**
